

Make a **PLAN**
BEFORE you **NEED** a plan.

Make an Evacuation Plan



1. **Identify multiple exits** out of your home or out of your property.
2. **Select a location** where everyone at your home or property will meet before you leave. This will let you make sure everyone is accounted for and you have all the items you need.

3. **Decide where** you will **evacuate to**. Go somewhere outside the danger zone, where you can have access to supplies. The homes of friends and family, or grocery store parking lots, etc.

4. Sign up for **emergency notifications** from your county.

A Go! Bag

Go! Bags have essentials in them like **food, water, money, phones, charging cords, passports, medicines, a smoke mask, a whistle, flashlight, batteries**, etc.



It is meant to grab and go and be reasonably sure you will survive.

There is MORE to think about!

Usually, we have additional important parts of our lives that won't fit into a simple Go! Bag. We need to plan for taking these with us, too.

✓ Plan for THESE!

PEOPLE

- ✓ babies, young children, elderly, invalids, injured, medication, etc.

PETS

- ✓ Pet carriers, leashes, water bowls, food, medication, etc.

LIVESTOCK

- ✓ How will you gather them?
How will you haul them?
Where will you take them?
What will you feed them?

PRESCRIPTIONS /MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

- ✓ Wheelchairs, oxygen tanks, IVs, etc.

COMPUTER EQUIPMENT

- ✓ If you need your computer for your livelihood, take it. Take the hard drives, power cords, etc.

PHONES

- ✓ And don't forget the charger cords.

PICTURES

- ✓ If you have family photos you want to keep, take the time now to take pictures of them on your phone. It's better than nothing.
